Purpose:

For relief of minor pain and/or fever reduction.

Indications:

- Headache
- Fever
- Muscle or body aches
- Pain

Assessment:

- Obtain patient’s history, including allergies, medication list and recent activity
- Vital Signs – heart rate, respirations, blood pressure, temperature, pain level and O2 sat level

Contraindications:


- Tylenol is generally safe to take during pregnancy, but should consult with PCP prior to taking.
- Do not administer if patient has any history of liver disease.

Standing Orders/Intervention:

Once assessment completed and **Assessment Protocol** indicates administration of Acetaminophen

- Administer oral dose of Acetaminophen 500mg tablets x 2

Acetaminophen - Medication protocol is part of Affiliated Physician’s **ON-SITE CLINIC PROGRAM**. Upon clinical assessment and necessity, these orders are to be activated by an Affiliated Physician’s on-site nurse and documentation of each episode is mandatory.
